## About Diagnostic Test Name Information

**Path: Clinical tab > More button (Customize group) > Diagnostic Tests > + button**

Labs, screens, imaging, and procedures that are performed in-house or sent out are all managed in OP through Diagnostic Test Set up. The Diagnostic Test Name Information window is used to link existing results to an existing test/lab, and add new in-house tests and results.

Diagnostic Tests are divided into the four categories listed below.



## Diagnostic Test Name Information Map

| Number | Section                | Description   |
|--------|------------------------|---|
| 1      | Basic Definition Tab   | The Basic Definition tab provides an overview for the test including laboratory, name, purpose, category, LOINC, Test ID, CPT Code, default DX code, result type, default result value(s), etc.     |
| 2      | Results Template       | The Results Template sets the desired results for the test/lab.   |
| 3      | Function buttons       | The function buttons add a test, edit a test, save a created or edited test, cancel a created or edited test, or refresh the test data.   |
| 4      | Add and Delete buttons | The <b>Add</b> and <b>Delete</b> buttons add or delete alerts for the test. If an alert is added, a message will appear when the test is ordered. This is an alert and will not print on the order. |


