

Entering Medications in the Patient Chart using CPOE (Computerized Physician Order Entry)

- >60% of Medication Orders during the reporting period:
 - Medication Recorded as one of the following:
 - Med to Dispense, or
 - · Med Office Sample, or
 - Med Administered, or
 - Med Office Vended







Entering Lab Orders in the Patient Chart using CPOE

- >30% of Labs Ordered during the reporting period
 - Labs orders requisition created in OP and must have a result date to count in the numerator
 - · Screening tests and Procedures do not count







Entering Radiology Orders in the Patient Chart using CPOE

- >30% of Radiology Orders during the reporting period
 - Radiology orders requisition created in OP and must have a result date to count in the numerator
